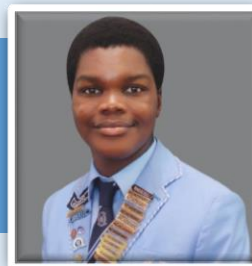
OUTSTANDING ACADEMIC ACHIEVEMENTS AND SUCCESSES AT GRANGE SCHOOL

REMINDERS

Water bottles- should be see-through plastic bottles for safety reasons.

Uniforms- Please take time to check your child's/ward's uniform to ensure that they still fit properly and are the right length and size. All students need a **white laboratory coat** for

science practical classes. It should be long-sleeved with buttons in front.

Hair- the boys should have a good haircut, and the girls should have their hair neatly done. Braids are not allowed for girls in years 7 to 10.

Lockers- a few students have misplaced or lost the keys to their lockers. They must resume with a new set of keys and locks to keep their lockers safe, as lockers left open pose a safety issue.

Phones, AirPods, and smartwatches are not allowed in school. When confiscated, they will be returned at the end of the term.
